

<p>Maths Recap and consolidate learning from the Early Years Foundation Stage curriculum</p> <p>Begin to follow the Year 1 Maths Curriculum</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Number and Place Value • Addition and Subtraction • Measurement • Geometry- properties of shape 	<p>English Phonics – We will begin by reviewing sounds learnt in the Reception class and we will learn further sounds and common words required in Year 1. The learning of phonics will be linked to both reading and spelling.</p> <p>We will be listening and watching clips from Disney films where there will be opportunities for drama and storytelling to inspire our vocabulary when beginning to write sentences.</p> <p>We will provide many opportunities in the classroom through our active learning for both creative and non-fiction writing.</p> <p>These forms of writing will provide opportunities for us to improve our handwriting, spelling and accurate writing of sentences.</p>	<p>Science As scientists we will be learning to:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Identify and name everyday materials • Identify how they are used in everyday life • Investigate their properties • Plan a test to investigate the most appropriate material for a specific purpose. • Make predictions and observations • Sort materials in a variety of ways. <p>This learning will focus on the materials used to build the homes of some of our favourite Disney characters.</p>
<p>Topic Our topic will provide opportunities to develop our skills in geography and history. We will link our topic work with our literacy where we will be learning about homes through Disney films which will be familiar to the children. We will be also be looking at animals from around the world and their environment, which links, with our work with our partner school, ‘Starfish Malawi’.</p> <p>An example includes looking at Fairy tale castles, what castles were like in the past and where and why castles are situated where they are.</p> <p>We will talk about inequalities and fairness and why some people may not have a home to live in. Nearer to Christmas we plan to set up a small food bank to help those who are less fortunate within our local area.</p>	<p>There’s no place like Home Autumn Term 2022</p> <p>Much of our learning will be based around some of the well-known Disney films which we love!
